Passion, hard work and dedication are just a few skills that IMGGA junior members learn through their experiences showing. From fitting to friendly competitions, our youth develop skills that mold them into leaders. The IMGGA Youth Points Chase (YPC) is an opportunity for additional recognition and rewards exclusively for junior members of the IMGGA.

The 2020 YPC program begins January 1, 2020 and will conclude with the IMGGA Fall Show, in September.

The YPC program will consist of the following:

1. Market goat division
2. Breeding goat division
3. Showmanship division
 - a. Senior (14-18 years of age)
 - b. Junior (9-13 years of age)
 - c. Pee-Wee (0-8 years of age)

Points will be counted and awarded in each division.

At the end of the year, the top 5 individuals in the market and breeding divisions, the top two individuals in each of the pee-wee, junior, and senior showmanship divisions, and the Overall High Points and Reserve High Point Individual will be recognized at the IMGGA Annual Banquet.

IMGGA Youth Members

- IMGGA youth participants must be current members of the IMGGA (and have a IMGGA membership number) as a farm membership (children listed with ages), or a junior member in good standing
- Youth must be 18 years of age and under as of January 1, 2020. There is no age limit, but youth must be able to safely handle their animal. Small children may have a heeler that is a youth member.
- Youth members or their immediate family must own the animal being shown. If a complaint or question is made regarding ownership of animal a committee will be appointed to investigate. If committee finds member not abiding by ownership rule, all acquired points will be forfeited.
- Youth members may earn points once they are IMGGA members.

- Youth members must physically show the goat; no substitute show person allowed unless approved by the BOD before the show. If a youth member has two animals in one class they may find another youth member to show second animal.
- All youth members and their families are expected to conduct themselves appropriately; failure to do so will result in forfeiture of all points.

Points are earned on the following basis:

Market and Breeding:

- Points for only two highest placing animals will be recorded for youth member at any one show.
- Youth member points will be tallied from their top 5 shows throughout the year. The IMGGA encourages the youth the show in as many shows as they like, though.
- Points are awarded for the youth member not the animal.
- Youth members will receive points based on the placing they get in the class with their animal.
- Overall Grand would receive 10 points and Reserve overall would receive 5 points. No points will be received for divisions.
- Points will be accumulated on how the goat places in a class whether or not the other exhibitors in the class are participating in the YPC.
- Points are based on the following:

- Youth are required to participate in a minimum of three showmanship competitions through the year to earn the end of the year awards. There is no maximum.
- Two points will be given to the 1st place winner, and one point will be given to the 2nd place winner. In the event of a tie the youth with the most 1st place spots will be the winner.
- Points are based on the following:

Showmanship	
Same points for all age divisions.	
Placing	Points
1st	2
2nd	1

Bonus Points:

Bonus points will be awarded to both market and breeding divisions.

A maximum of 50 bonus points can be awarded to each participant for the year.

Bonus points can be earned through volunteering at JIMGA events and IMGA promotions.

YPC Participating Shows

- To qualify as a sanctioned show, a show must provide market classes, breeding classes and showmanship classes.
- If the participating show is a two-day show, showmanship is only required on one of the two days. A champion and a reserve will need to be picked in showmanship.

Showmanship divisions

- a. Senior (14-18 years of age)
 - b. Junior (9-13 years of age)
 - c. Pee-Wee (0-8 years of age)
- Prizes are at the shows discretion.
 - Each show will set its own rules for the class size, weight, or age breaks for the market and breeding classes. Please follow IMGA breaks for showmanship.

- Sanctioned shows must be open to any IMGGA youth member.
- Notify IMGGA BOD or Tahra Bedwell, IMGGA Secretary to participate in the YPC.
- The IMGGA will contact the show secretary prior to the show with a spreadsheet that can be used to record results.
- A copy of the show results can be emailed to iowameatgoat@gmail.com within 7 days of the conclusion of the show.
- If a show does not comply with the above rules, a show may be banned from sanctioning with the YPC.
